PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, the observance of Concrete Pavement Week was selected to commemorate the signing of the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1956 on June 29, 1956; and

WHEREAS, concrete pavement is of enduring importance to sustainable communities and to the health, safety, and well-being of the people of Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, concrete pavement systems support safe, reliable, and high-performing transportation networks, delivering superior resilience and minimizing long-term maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the concrete pavement industry drives economic development, creates valuable jobs, and enhances the public tax base; and

WHEREAS, advancements in concrete pavement technologies are enabling our Commonwealth to achieve ambitious environmental goals by leveraging recyclable materials, cooler surfaces, and improved vehicle efficiency.

THEREFORE, I, Josh Shapiro, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby proclaim June 28–July 4, 2026, to be
